The Goldstein/Holiday Panhellenic Achievement Award was established in February of 2023 by the Greater Kansas City Alumnae Panhellenic Association. The award is designed to recognize members of this organization, past or present, who have served the organization well and made significant and lasting contributions. Consider this award an opportunity to show distinction and appreciation to a Panhellenic sister who elevated her contributions beyond the ordinary. All candidates will receive equal consideration.

Criteria

- **A minimum of 10-years of service to the Greater Kansas City Alumnae Panhellenic Association (need not be consecutive years)**
- Nominees may have served in a combination of officer, Delegate, or Alternate Delegate statuses.
- Nominee's service to the organization embodies the Panhellenic Creed which encourages "wide and wise human service".
- The award is cumulative – many contributions over the 10+ years rather than a single contribution.
- We are looking to identify members who have made significant, meaningful, and impactful contributions that have elevated the organization's positive impact and inclusiveness.
- Self-nominations are not accepted.

Guidelines

- If a recipient is selected, **the award** will be presented at the Annual Meeting, **but it is not required to be awarded every year.**
- **This award is one of distinction. There may be** one recipient each year.
- **Nominations are due to the Ex-Officio** via email no later than January 31 of each year. All documents must be submitted by this date.
- Nominating Committee – In addition to the Ex-Officio (chair of nominating committee), two other members of the delegation will be voted on at the October meeting. Nominations for the two positions will be taken from the floor and voted on by the Delegate and one Alternate Delegate in attendance at the October meeting.
- Only two nominees may be brought forward to the organization for the vote.
- **Prior to the March meeting, a closed ballot will be emailed to each Delegate and one Alternate Delegate to cast their vote.** Eligible voting members may cast a single vote. For a nominee to become a recipient, the nominee must receive two-thirds of the vote.
- **Nominees are excluded from voting.**
- Previous nominees may be nominated again, but previous recipients are not eligible.

Award

- **Recipient(s) will receive** a National Panhellenic Coat of Arms pin.
